NICHOLAS RUDD



The Columbia University Club of New York mourns the passing of our esteemed Governor Nicholas Rudd '64CC, '67BUS. Nick was appointed by President Lee Bollinger to serve on the Board of Governors in 2004. He played key roles in the Club's strategic planning and marketing. Nick counseled the Columbia Alumni Association and its antecedents on marketing and communications and helped start the Strategic Communications program in Continuing Education. He co-designed an Executive Education program on branding for the Business School. Nick was the driving force behind the Columbia Alumni Singers. Without him, the idea of the Singers would never have resulted in the two Reunion Weekend concerts and its promising future as a valued component of Columbia tradition.

For his distinguished service to Columbia University, Nick was awarded the Columbia Alumni Medal at the 2012 Columbia University Commencement Ceremonies. He was also on the Board of the Stamford (CT) Symphony and sang bass with the Greenwich Choral Society.

He is survived by his wife Judith C. Anderson '72GS, '82BUS and sons Alex Rudd and Ken Rudd.

LIFESAVING VACCINES: WHY THE BACKLASH?

The CDC has hailed immunizations as one of the greatest medical accomplishments of the 20th century, and yet the anti-vaccine movement is still going strong. Despite the medical community's unanimous endorsement of immunization's benefit and the retraction of scientific research suggesting the hazards of vaccines, the movement still attracts continues to attract celebrity supporters and media attention. The backlash has now become a public health issue as An increasing number of parents are refusing to vaccinate their children and the prevalence of vaccine-preventable diseases, such as pertussis and measles, are on the rise. This discussion will explore the history of the vaccine movement, the issues surrounding the risks and benefits of the vaccine, and the ethical dilemmas vaccination poses to providers.

Dr. Rita Marie John, DNP, EdD, CPNP, PMHS, Associate Professor of Clinical Nursing, Columbia University School of Nursing, has been the director of its Pediatric Nurse Practitioner program for over 10 years.
