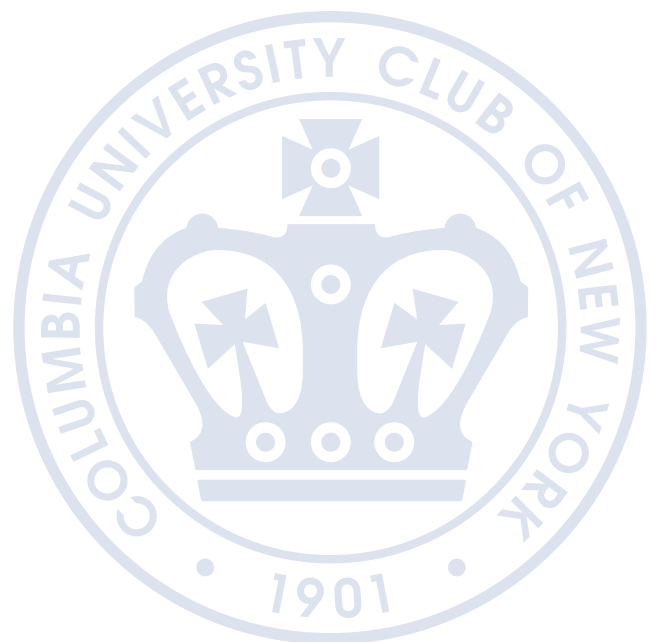

## REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

During the 2012-2013 fiscal year, the Columbia University Club of New York (CUCNY) undertook a number of exciting projects and activities. We have made great progress implementing our new affiliation agreement with the Princeton Club of New York (PCNY), growing membership, refreshing the Columbia University Club of New York visual identity, creating new ways to communicate with our members, and improving administrative work procedures.

The overview that follows, and the subsequent Committee reports, provide a glimpse of the energy and dedication with which Club Officers, Governors, and staff undertook important ongoing and new Club initiatives.

The primary goal of any Club initiative is, and will continue to be, to improve the Club and the member experience.

I am excited to report that the Club has hired a new Director of Membership and Marketing. Melissa Shafer '12CC joined the administrative staff less than one month ago, but her influence can already be felt. Melissa will play a pivotal role in providing consistent and steady support for you, our members.

### Club Finances

The Club remains on solid financial footing thanks to the steady guidance of our Treasurer and Finance Committee Chairman, Gerald Sherwin '55CC, and Finance Committee members, Jay D. Rao '08 LAW and James P. Gerkis '80CC, '83LAW. One factor contributing to the Club's overall financial health has been increased membership. With consideration for the short fiscal year (ten months), and the potential impact of the overall reduction of membership dues, the Board of Governors approved a budget of projected 2012-2013 dues income cautiously. As a result of our increase in membership, dues revenue will exceed budget projections. The Club was able to undertake several important marketing and membership projects as a direct result of the increased dues income and operating finances.

The second important factor in maintaining the Club's financial equilibrium was the renegotiated affiliation agreement with the Princeton Club of New York (PCNY). As a result of efficient advocacy on the part of President Mark L. Amsterdam '66CC, '69LAW, CUCNY emerged from the affiliation negotiation with the clear recognition by all parties that CUCNY members contribute significantly to the general operating expenses and the overall well-being of the clubhouse. On an ongoing basis, CUCNY members account for approximately 50% of the dining revenue, 30-50% of the banquet revenue, and a significant percentage of the room and fitness revenue.

The CUCNY 2013-2014 budget was unanimously approved at the May 1, 2013 Board of Governors meeting.

### Club Membership

Guided by strong leadership and the dynamic participation of all of our Governors, Club membership is at an all-time high. Between May 31, 2012 and May 31, 2013 we saw a **39.5% increase** in CUCNY members. CUCNY is within reach of matching, or surpassing, PCNY membership.

Attracting new interest in CUCNY membership was a 2012-2013 priority. Our stalwart methods of getting the word out about the benefit of membership remain in place, but we have added a few new methods to our marketing arsenal. Club staff is actively participating in campus events, including commencement and reunions, in an effort to bring a CUCNY presence to important campus experiences.

## Membership Marketing Strategies

1. In an effort to heighten general awareness, CUCNY invited groups of alumni and students to select events hosted at the clubhouse. Included were alumni and students from Columbia College, Barnard College, the Business School, the Law School, the School of Public Health, and the School of Nursing.

On January 17, 2013, CUCNY hosted a successful networking cocktail reception for Law and Business School alumni: 427 alumni attended the event. Conversation with guests provided anecdotal evidence confirming our suspicions that many of the guests were unaware of the Club before the event. In order to more systematically gauge the effectiveness of such efforts, tracking specific information about member applications, conversion of applications to memberships, and dues income is becoming standard practice.

2. We are also experimenting with event sponsorship as a tool to heighten awareness of the Club. On April 17, 2013, the CUCNY sponsored the spring award ceremony for the Columbia Venture Community. CUCNY proved to be a popular destination for CVC members, garnering the largest event attendance CVC had had to date. As a result of CUCNY sponsorship, CVC (membership 2,500) will continue to be a resource for the Club as we find ways to reach and support our more entrepreneurial members.

3. The Columbia Alumni Association (CAA) and the school-based alumni directors continue to support our efforts. CAA co-sponsors important university-related events at the Club, features CUCNY on the CAA website, and actively assists the Club's marketing efforts to reach Columbia alumni and the wider University community. Special thanks should go to Donna H. MacPhee '89CC and Kenneth Catandella for all of their efforts on behalf of CUCNY. We look forward to our continuing partnership with all of our Columbia University partners.

As we move into the 2013-2014 membership year, our commitment to low membership dues continues. Working with PCNY, we were able to keep dues at approximately the same monthly rate as 2012-2013 dues. CUCNY negotiated for a special membership category for EMBA and other executive program students. CUCNY will continue membership efforts with former members and international alumni.

Michael C. Foss '03CC, '12GSAPP, chairman of the Membership and Marketing Committee, David A. Evans '99EN, William Jordan V '06GS, Jay Rao '08 LAW, and Regen Wallis have all devoted countless hours to guiding, suggesting, implementing, and analyzing our membership and marketing efforts. CUCNY is more effective because of their generous efforts.

As Michael C. Foss notes in his committee report, the Club mourns the loss of Governor Nicholas Rudd '64 CC, '67BU. There are really no words to describe the impact of this loss. Nick's influence and wisdom are greatly missed.

## **CUCNY Visual Identity and Member Communication**

The CUCNY visual identity project continues to develop. All current CUCNY print communication pieces are fully transitioned to the new identity format (including newsletters, stationary, information packets, welcome packets, member statements, envelopes, promotional flyers, and Club banners).

As we strive to find efficient, innovative, and cost effective ways to reach our members, we have developed a number of regular electronic communications to keep members better informed about events and clubhouse news. At the suggestion of CUCNY members, we increased the frequency of our electronic communication from once a month to once a week, with the addition of special invitations for important events and critical clubhouse communication.

Perhaps our most significant visual improvement is the new CUCNY website. The site reflects our effort to make information for current members and prospective members accessible and concise. Now that the site has launched, we are in the critical review period. We are open to your suggestions and advice as we continue to improve the website. Our next step will be to integrate reservation and bill paying functionality into the site.

Developing a strong social media strategy is high on the agenda for 2013-2014.

Governors Nabeel Ahmad '09TC, David A. Evans '99EN, Michael C. Foss '03CC, '12GSAPP, and William Jordan V '06GS recognized the need to update the look and feel of our communications and encouraged the staff to move toward more efficient and modern communication solutions. They offered creative and technically adept insights to some of the most challenging problems.

It is important to note that Nicholas Rudd was instrumental in laying the ground work for all of the accomplishments listed above.

## **Programs**

The Program Committee and Young Alumni Committee deserve special acknowledgement for creating stellar programs this year.

The committee chairs and committee members demonstrated their creativity and influence in bringing us programs featuring President Lee C. Bollinger, President Debora L. Spar, Governor Madeleine M. Kunin, and Professor Ira Katznelson. At a spotlight event, members were introduced to the Columbia Global Centers by Safwan Masri, the Vice President for the Global Centers, and a group of distinguished panelists: Professor Lila Abu-Lughod, Dean Carol Becker, Professor Vishakha Desai, Dean Jeanette Takamura. At other events, members were quizzed on wine, tasted craft beers, learned to rethink creativity, visited museums and galleries, and even touched scorpions! Yet to come is a conversation with William D. Cohan '83JRN, '87BUS, Mike Lipper '57CC, and Jason Zweig '82CC about the role that financial media sources play in markets, investor mentality, and speculative tendencies.

The committee members are working hard to keep event costs down so that programs are accessible to all of our members and their guests.

Thanks go to John Celock '04JRN, Angela Holuba '09BC, '10P&S, '12PH, Justin Ifill '06CC, Donna Rosenthal '67SW, Michael Shiba '08LAW, Anne-Renée Testa '91TC, Tiffany Woo '87BC, and Regen Wallis for their dedication to creating engaging programs throughout the year.

The Columbia Club Foundation continues to fund the important United Nations Ambassador Lecture Series. This year, Ambassador Christopher Hill spoke to a highly engaged audience of CUCNY and United Nation Association members here at the Club and H. E. Ambassador Masood Khan invited CUCNY members to the Pakistani Mission for a fascinating program on Pakistan and the United Nations. Planning is underway for 2013-2014 programs with the gracious and continued support of the Foundation.

### **Member Accounting**

This has been a challenging year for member accounting. We are working with the accounting staff to find solutions that will make the member account experience smoother and more accurate. We are optimistic that we will be able to find remedies for the more frustrating member concerns.

Quarterly dues billing is no longer available as a payment option for members. We encourage members who were automatically billed quarterly for their dues to consider requesting monthly automatic billing. This can be initiated by calling the office with payment information. Members who have a credit card on file can request that automatic billing continue.

### **Clubhouse**

Implementation of the new affiliation agreement with the Princeton Club of New York is well under way. Our Clubs are working together to build exciting programs for our members, coordinate member communication, and improve accounting processes. Clubhouse rooms on the second and third floor have been renamed to reflect the Columbia campus. CUCNY visual representation throughout the clubhouse includes photography in The Grill and portraits in the Alexander Hamilton Room. A project to include additional Columbia images on the fourth floor will be undertaken in the coming year.

David Gibson '75GSAPP continues to represent CUCNY at House Committee meetings and is an invaluable resource in our ongoing implementation of all CUCNY House projects. David will also keep us up to date on clubhouse projects funded by members' voluntary capital improvement contributions. We stress that this contribution is voluntary, but funds are slated to improve our clubhouse environment.

### **Board Transition and CUCNY Planning**

Mark L. Amsterdam '65CC, '69 LAW has stepped down as President of the Board of Governors. He will remain on the Board as a Presidential Appointee.

James P. Gerkis '80CC, '83 LAW has been elected President of the Board for a three year term.

Keith Goggin '91JRN has been appointed by Columbia University as a Presidential Appointee to the Board of Governors of the Club.

Craig Brod '77CC has been elected as a Governor of the Club.

Jay Rao '08 LAW and Justin Ifill '06CC have been re-elected as Governors of the Club.

Michael C. Foss '03CC, '12GSAPP leaves the Board of Governors as a Presidential appointee. Michael has agreed to continue his service on the Membership and Marketing Committee.

Patricia L. Francy '84BUS is leaving the Board after a distinguished tenure. Patty is credited with being instrumental in the ongoing success of CUCNY.

CUCNY committees will meet at least once over the summer to set priorities for 2013-2014.

I want to take this opportunity to personally thank President Amsterdam for his dedicated leadership and his involvement and mentorship during my first year as the Executive Director of the Club. I have never known such a committed volunteer. The Club will continue to benefit from his continuing support and advice in his new capacity as Presidential Appointee and member of the Columbia University Club of New York Executive Committee.

Special thanks must also be extended to you, our members. The Club is what it is because of your enthusiasm, involvement, and support.

This year we have had many important events both at the Club and off-site. The Columbia Alumni Association has been of great assistance in sponsoring some of these events, such as the evening with University President Lee Bollinger. For other events, the CAA has helped to support the events and helped to publicize them. We are most appreciative of their support. Many people were responsible for bringing us these events, but I want to thank, in particular, the Program Committee and its chairs John Celock, Justin Ifill, and Regen Wallis, and the Young Alumni Committee chaired by Justin Ifill, Michael Shiba, and Regen Wallis.

Our Finance Committee headed by our Treasurer, Gerald Sherwin, has been extraordinarily diligent, and has been successful in helping us increase our reserves while also acting as the prudent steward of our income and disbursements.

We continue to work closely with the Board of Governors of the Princeton Club in our efforts to improve the Club, and in particular to make it more amenable to Columbia Club members.

What does the future hold? We will continue to place strong emphasis on remaining financially strong, and will be prudent, but creative, in our use of funds to provide outstanding programs for our members. We will also continue to modernize our website to be a useful tool for members and to attract more members. We will continue to focus on increasing our membership, and providing quality benefits for our members. This next year will continue see an extensive program schedule with many new events and speakers. While remaining financially prudent, we will also seek to increase our programming and our social events for the benefit of our members.

We will continue to do our best to have the Club serve our members as a home away from home, an extension of Columbia's campuses, and a place to enjoy old friends and meet new ones.

I am proud of what we have accomplished this year. I am grateful for the opportunity to have served as President and I thank the Governors for their generosity of time and spirit. I also want to express my personal thanks to the Club's Executive Director Jennifer Shaw for everything she does for us.

Finally, I want to thank all our members for their support, and reaffirm to you how important your membership is to the Club and to the University.

## **FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT**

Finances for the Columbia University Club of New York in fiscal year 2013 have shown an increase in net revenue. The reserve fund holds about one year's operating expenses. The new agreement with the Princeton Club has resulted in a fiscal year change from July to June (vs. September to August in previous years).

The Finance Committee has continued to support the other Club committees in helping to increase membership.

The rate structure for membership renewal and new entries has also been a factor in increasing membership numbers.

Plans are underway to attract young alumni. The Club hosted its annual event for graduating Seniors in May 2013: over 200 people attended the function. Again, this summer, the Club and CAA will co-host the very popular Rooftop Happy Hour.

In addition, special events utilizing Columbia professors, President Lee Bollinger, and key people in the Global Centers were put forth at the Club.

There has been a concerted effort to try to get other topical events at the Club (i.e. panels on Healthcare, Entrepreneurship, etc.). In early June 2013, the Columbia Club was a major presence during reunion activities both on and off campus.

Various Columbia publications have been used to open the Club to the Columbia community with high profile events being utilized to attract alumni in the Greater New York area and by raising the Club's presence, especially in Manhattan.

## **MEMBERSHIP AND MARKETING COMMITTEE REPORT**

The 2013 Fiscal Year saw strong growth in the Columbia University Club of New York's membership. The Club currently has 2,546 dues paying members (as of March 2013), an increase of 721 new members (39.5%) from March 2012. Membership growth was almost even geographically: Metropolitan (+35.6%), Greater Metropolitan (+37%), and Regional (+29%). Membership growth ranged from 20.7% (Regional Retired) to 45.8% (Regional 7th, 8th, 9th Year Out) when examined by age range.

Membership growth has been driven by the outreach efforts of the Club's staff to potential members, focused efforts to disseminate information about the Club through a variety of channels, especially at CAA events, and the continued benefits of the lower membership dues brought about by the Club's new Affiliation Agreement that was signed in early 2012.

The Committee also worked to more fully implement the Club's new branding and, in conjunction with the Website Committee, to complete the Club's new website, which has recently launched. Marketing efforts at commencement, reunions, and orientation, and in various University publications, continue as well.

The Committee mourned the passing of longtime member Nicholas Rudd '64CC, '67BUS in September. Nick was a tremendous asset to the Committee, who brought decades of experience in marketing and advertising, and personally developed many of the advertisements run by the Club in Columbia Magazine and Columbia College Today.

This year, Michael Foss will be stepping down as the Committee's Chair. Craig Brod '77CC, '80LAW and Regen Wallis will be the new chairs. They both bring a wealth of experience to the position.

We also continue to maintain a productive working relationship with Princeton Club program officials. The synergy forged by these relationships is a key to providing quality programming for our members.

The committee has been working closely with Jennifer Shaw, the Club's Executive Director. Jennifer's energy and creative ideas have helped the committee provide high quality events to its members.
